Alda is an island state and a popular tourist destination with an area of 5,233 square kilometres and a population of 3.1 million inhabitants that faces a major problem of **desertification** and is one of the high-risk areas. Rising temperatures, decreasing rainfall, drought and worsening extreme weather events threaten the island's ecosystem with frequent fires during the summer months. This climate crisis has led to a drastic reduction in agricultural production, leading the local population to food insecurity, unemployment, poverty and migration. **Militant factions** offering protection to residents are taking advantage of the social malaise to recruit members, endangering state structures and the safety of tourists, up to and including armed attacks against them.

Mass Protest in Alda: Youth Activists Condemn Government Inaction on Climate Crisis

In Alda, 200 young members of the environmental organisation “Turu” protested in front of the Parliament, denouncing, as they say, the inaction of the current government on the climate crisis. This act expresses the indignation and anger of **climate activists** who, through mass mobilisations, are trying to show their opposition to the state’s apathy towards the ever-growing issue of environmental destruction. The activists are outraged at politicians for not taking the necessary civil protection measures in the middle of summer for the country’s major fires at a time when thermal insulation is required for all buildings in the country by 2050, which is provided for by law through tax expenditures. The incident is reported in the international media and becomes a catalyst for widespread demands for **environmental protection**.

Solution



As a member of the environmental group “Save Alda” we painted the facade of the Ministry of Environment and Energy with green paint, demanding that the government immediately address the environmental disasters in our country. This incident of vandalism, as they call it, is an expression of hatred towards the politicians who risk our health, jobs and safety every day. The time has come to **take the law into our own hands.**

As an employee of the Ministry of Environment and Energy, I started a **social media campaign** to inform and sensitize my fellow citizens about the environmental crisis and the destruction the planet is experiencing due to government decisions. This action has received a positive response from people and colleagues.

I have been involved for years in many **peaceful protests** and I often organise speeches at eco-festivals to protect the environment. I always assert my right to a sustainable and healthy environment. I believe that collective and organized street protests can put pressure on the government of the day to make reforms to protect the ecosystem. After many days of protests in the city center, the Minister has announced new measures to protect woodlands amid a heatwave.

Firestorm of Outrage: Journalist Blames Government for Climate Crisis and Fires

The multiple fire fronts of the past weeks in Alda were a nightmare that passed only to return, as has been the case every summer for many years. On the 8 o'clock news, journalist Mrs. Brand, denounces that the climate crisis is bringing poverty and war and blames the government for the crime of the fires, the death of innocent citizens and the untold destruction of their property. She even blamed the ministry for granting construction licenses to multinational companies to build tourist resorts in natural areas that should be protected. Through a video she showed how an idyllic seaside landscape with a hotel has been turned into ashes after the passage of fire. These statements by the journalist were perceived as "lies" and as **"defamation for the country"** and the minister put pressure on the channel's executives to fire the journalist immediately. This decision provoked **public outrage**.

Solution



As someone deeply opposed to the prevailing system, I could not stand idly by and organised an **armed mobilisation** against the TV channel's directors. In one night, we burned 23 cars of the station's directors and shareholders. We took 4 cameramen hostage, determined to force the return of the journalist to her post, to ensure justice against the capital that censors and kills us day after day for the tourists' money, with no regard for our land.

Solution



As a fellow journalist, I was disappointed by Ms. Brandt's dismissal. I started an **online petition** and shared it with colleagues from newspapers, magazines, TV channels and blogs, garnering a groundswell of support. Within days many people wrote in the various articles and posts with #WithMrsBrand!

Solution



With the help of the energetic journalist Mrs Brand, many non-profit organizations and charities, I started an **environmental initiative**, we are reforesting, campaigning for recycling, writing articles on feminist ecology, replanting trees and flowers in the urban fabric, promoting the reuse of furniture and clothes, to reduce the country's environmental footprint as much as possible.

Tye-Meláne: A Cycle of Destruction - Fires, Floods, and the Climate Debate

In a lowland area called Tye-Meláne in the state of Alda right after the fires, the floods arrived! There was no time to close the great debate about the fires, which opened again agonizingly - as every year - about **climate change**, the need for extensive deforestation to create firebreaks and the removal of “dangerous” biomass from the forests, and people drowned in their homes, shops and cars. Scientists point out that extreme events, such as the floods today or the fires yesterday, are created down here on earth by the **mismanagement** of soil and water, which is clearly reflected in the landscape.

In the last year I have seen many videos of fringe groups **offering protection** to our vulnerable citizens by providing them with essentials, facilities and increasing their sense of security, thus responding to the incompetence of the state apparatus. Thus, I decided to participate in the attack against three politicians who built arbitrary houses, legalised over time by the state, in an area of formerly burnt forest that is unable to prevent the waters and the intensity of the rain.

As an active member of a **self-managed solidarity kitchen** last weekend, we collected and delivered 4 tons of food and distributed 3000 portions of hot homemade food to the flood victims of the area as a minimal sign of support and compassion in this difficult time. This act once again indicates the complete absence of state engineering and the need to be there for each other.

Solution



As a member of a green NGO with many scientists as members, I believe that we have the means to tame all these extremes. The solutions are so simple and can be implemented immediately with **local environmental actions**, even in each individual municipality. With the help of scientists and the local government, we are launching projects to retain rainwater to the maximum extent possible, returning it to the ground, instead of constantly driving it to the sea on the surface with incredibly expensive pharaonic structures. By thus enriching the water table, we can directly restore our soils, making them of higher quality and more productive, preventing fires and floods, and even correcting our climate by restoring the water cycles of our region.

Urban Greenery in Crisis: The Battle for Trees and Parks in Alda

In recent years, Alda has had very **few street trees** and even **fewer parks**, a fact that has upset the citizens of the country, as this phenomenon is now occurring in many municipalities and neighborhoods. Several trees have been cut down by decision of the local authorities and no new ones have been planted in their place. The leaf area of the trees, the amount of oxygen they produce and the shade they provide to combat the heat island effect are gradually diminishing. The mayors are not taking the necessary steps to help the city in this climate crisis plaguing the region. At the same time, residents are requesting urban parks, while private companies want to turn spaces into giant shopping malls that also attract tourists.

On a spring afternoon, **disheartened residents** of the Norno neighborhood began breaking through the concrete of a central private parking lot to plant trees in a space that was granted 17 years ago to the city by the Alda Technical Chamber to become a park. Since then, instead of a park, the lot was adorned with a paid parking lot until residents took matters into their own hands and began tearing it down. They had put up a red banner that read “Their parking lot, our park.”

Volunteer groups started **tree planting** and patrolling on 200 acres of the municipality to show their practical support to the residents of the neighborhood who want to save the last breath of greenery in their city.

Residents of many municipalities are trying by every legal means to protect their parks from greedy businessmen who are forcing shopping malls and stores in the place of green space. Students, seniors and neighborhood shopkeepers, housewives with their children, along with lawyers and engineers, are the postmodern activists next door who decide to turn their neighborhood into a free public space for green space, play and artistic events. Through **legal action**, signature gathering and mass peaceful mobilizations they are asking the municipality not to turn the parks into a place of private exploitation. Through these collective actions the city has stopped the development of construction projects from public parks, and we expect newer reports.

Balancing Tourism's Economic Benefits with Environmental Costs

This morning the Prime Minister gave a speech in which he said, "The **tourism industry** is an important industry in the country, with a significant contribution to employment and wealth creation, especially on an island such as ours". However, at the same time recent studies by scientists estimate that the global tourism industry is responsible for around 5-6% of the planet's **carbon emissions**. In addition, tourism pressure reduces the habitat of ecologically important species and leads to the depletion of natural resources, while over-tourism leads to the loss of biodiversity in protected areas and the deterioration of the economies around them. The two debates are acrimonious and raise the ire of many.

A group of highly activist environmentalists has made death threats against the Prime Minister and taken some tourists as **hostages**. They are angry with the government for not doing enough to stop climate change and have made serious demands. More specifically, they ask the government to immediately shut down the biggest tourist spots on the island and admit in public that tourism is destroying the environment. They also want the government to stop any future tourism projects and to ban the use of fossil fuels across the country.

In response to what happened, I will participate in the first voluntary environmental clean-up action of the municipality where I live permanently, from 1 to 10 October, entitled "Cleaning and beautifying our place". The aim of this action is to foster **environmental education** among young citizens and raise awareness among older ones. The actions to be carried out are as follows: cleaning of all neighborhoods and streets, cleaning of tourist areas and beach cleaning.

Solution



Under **the slogan “Walk for the next generations”**, thousands of citizens held a climate march in the capital Alda. Members of activist and ecological organisations flooded the streets of the city and demanded that the government take action to protect the environment, just weeks before the 21st Climate Summit on the island of Alda. One of the main demands of the protesters was to pressure big companies and tourism businesses to reduce activities that can harm nature and find energetic ways of production that are more environmentally friendly. They urged hotels and tourist accommodation to target their green energy transition to help mitigate the climate crisis.

Balwana is a country located in the Southern Ocean. The south of Balwana has some **amazing nature with crystal clear waters** which is only where the attention of the government is focused on. I will be creating an **online petition** so that other people that are affected by the lack of public transport can also express their resentment. I am also planning in **arranging a group** so that we can collectively brainstorm on how we can improve the situations with possible recommendations.

Suzanne is a 60-year-old woman living alone and has been renting her apartment for 20+ years in the **city center of Balwani's capital**. In the past year, various rich inhabitants have **been buying land and houses** around converting them either into **offices or apartment buildings**. The building that Suzanne is living has been sold to a businessman which aims to convert it into office apartments thus all of the residents are asked to move out in 6 months. Suzanne does not know what to do as her pension can barely cover the rent of a different apartment.

I can't stand this housing situation; this is a stressful situation. I've heard about a group where you can reach out but sometimes, they use violent and illegal means. At this point I **don't care**, I just want to find a place to live.

Balwana Scenario 2 Solution



I believe I should **call** the government. It is unacceptable to leave their citizens are homeless just because some reach people buy everything. I will call them and ask more information about **public housing or economic** support by the government.

Balwana Scenario 2 Solution



I have seen a group circulating recently about the housing situation and they organize **support groups**. I think I am going to join their meeting and see how we can improve the situation.

Balwana Scenario



3

Henry leaves right on the **coast** of Balwana. He has been notified by his landlord that he needs to leave the apartment by May. Henry suspects that the owner will be renting the apartment for the **holidays** since she informed him that the apartment will be available again in October in case he is interested to rent again then. Henry has been looking for other apartments to rent however everything in the coast is only available for short term renting. He thought about renting short term, however the worth of those months is double the rent. His last resort is to go back to his family house, but it is quite far away from his job.

The landlord had it coming, I am going to camp outside of her house so that she understands how **desperate** I am!

Balwana Scenario 3 Solution



I think I am going to **talk** to my landlord. I will explain to her that everything is so expensive, and I am not able to afford anything else. I will ask her if I will be able to extend my stay until I find somewhere else or see if we can find a **common ground**. In the meantime, I will still keep looking.

Balwana Scenario 3 Solution



I have seen online that there is a **resident's rights group**, amidst this housing crisis that has come up. I will be contacting them on possible actions and ask them about information on some affordable housing options, I am sure that they can help. It is important to **stick together as a community** and **help each other**, and I am really grateful that this group has been created.

4

Ariel has been travelling around her hometown through her **bicycle** to reach her work and other outings. There was always a lack of appropriate infrastructures but currently due to the increased tourist visits in the town it is beginning to get difficult and dangerous for her safety. On top of that, the **increase in temperature** is making bicycling unbearable but there is no other option.

The situation is really getting out of hand and I can't stand it anymore, I need to do **something immediately**. I will be getting some paint and splashing it outside the town council's members, to see if they enjoy not being able to move comfortably!

I will be starting a petition for the creation of proper infrastructures in the town. There should be bicycle roads and since no one is making the move I will be initiating this!

I have been talking with a lot of people using their bicycle and all of us have the same issues. We decided to form a group where we will meet bi-weekly, discussing our needs and prepare some **recommendations**. We will then take our recommendations to the town council and discuss what we can do about this.

Sarah & Daniel have 2 kids and live in Balwana's **capital**. Due to the mass tourism almost all year round as many other people, they have decided to move into the urban areas as there are more opportunities however, due to the density of the populations in the urban town's food supplies have started to become limited. There have been various cases where they needed to go through multiple grocery stores to find some essential items. There were cases where several foods like fruits, vegetables and even bread could not have been found anywhere. They are beginning to feel insecure as their salaries do not allow them to move in a different place where the situation is better.

We have decided to open a **collective kitchen initiative**. In this way all of us will bring everything that we have in order to create nutritious meals while also bonding together with the community and come up with initiatives that will help the situation.

MetaChampion World League Local Tensions Rise with Foreign Fans

Trotlemonts, a **local football team** from northern Corelandic, has become the first team in the country to qualify for the MetaChampion World League. This marks the first time foreign teams and their **fans** visit Corelandic. However, the town where Trotlemonts is based is not prepared to handle such a large number of visitors. Chaos at the Court A Call for Calm

After a series of **sexual harassment scandals** in Corelandic's main athletic federation, several senior directors are now on trial. The situation has deeply **polarised the public**, with many expressing anger towards the accused, while others post messages defending abusive behaviour. These conflicting views are destabilising civic society and undermining ongoing efforts to promote **gender equality**. Outside the courthouse, an **angry mob** gathers, creating a tense and volatile atmosphere.

You **set up a small stage** and address the crowd, recognising their concerns while encouraging calm discussion.

You join the crowd and speak to several people, firmly sharing your perspective despite **disagreements that arise** against the demonstrators.

Corelandic E-Sports Scandal Corruption and Events Cancellation

A **match-fixing scandal** involving the main team in the country's top e-sports league hits the headlines, bringing very bad publicity to Corelandic. The scandal uncovers a network of corruption involved in **illegal betting schemes** tied to eSports events. In response, the political authorities decide to **cancel all eSports events nationwide** and defund the entire ecosystem. This decision causes outrage among the eSports community, leading to widespread **youth riots** across the country.

You go to a **protest** near a major sports venue, joining others who want to disrupt upcoming events. You may not be able to change the situation, but at least you can show your **frustration**.

Fractured Community Youth Protest Against Touristic Developments

You are visiting a small village where young people used to spend their free time at a **youth sports centre**, which was demolished to make way for **touristic developments**. Since the facilities haven't been replaced, many young people have grown resentful toward tourists, boycotting businesses and development projects. Tensions escalated during a **protest at the building site**, leading to heated arguments and injuries.

You form a **committee** with locals and hold a meeting at the town hall to discuss ways to address young people's concerns and **community's needs**.

Building Bridges Through Sport A Community's Response to Hate

A group of **asylum seekers** has recently arrived in Corelandic, and civic organisations are working to support their **integration** into the local community. A local NGO starts a **sports programme** to bring together migrants and locals from **different backgrounds and religions**, with the support of well-known football players to raise awareness about the initiative. However, a group of **hooligans** begins spreading **hate speech** and false claims about the programme on social media.

You notice the **hateful posts** online and recognise they are based on **misinformation**. You avoid engaging directly, as you think it might give them more attention, and instead focus on attending the sports matches to support the programme as you can.

You read the posts and find some of them **amusing**. Thinking they are **harmless**, you share a few with friends as a **joke**.

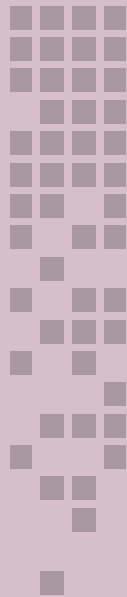

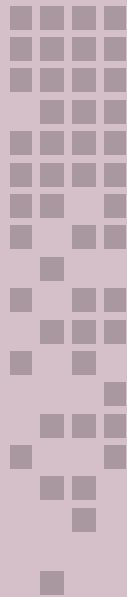

Demostinet Scenario 2 Solution



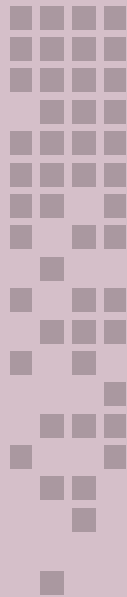

Indeed, a **government representative** reached out to acknowledge the beauty of our initiatives and stated “I will personally put pressure on the government to embrace nature and technology in a different way”.

Demostinet Scenario 2 Solution



It is unfair that this decision has been made without consulting us, the citizens of Demostinet. So, we have decided to take control and send a clear message to the institutions and officials working on this urban plan. We are ready to do whatever it takes to put an end to this so-called requalification plan. We **sabotaged** the plan **cutting off the wires** of this new technology. We believe that if they will lose money with our actions, next time they will think twice before approving a plan without consulting us!

Demostinet is renowned for its fine artistic taste, which has always attracted tourists from all over the world. However, a recent country council meeting introduces a new policy that restricts public creative exhibitions. From now on, anyone wishing to perform in public spaces must pay a fee of 150 euros, and they will not be allowed to receive any donations during their performances. If they do, they risk a fine of 200 euros.

We have come so far! As community advocates, we organised a series of **public workshops** and discussions about the importance of **creative expression in public spaces**. Our collaboration has sparked a protest in the form of artistic exhibitions happening simultaneously across various parts of Demostinet. It is amazing to see how this initiative has attracted artists, citizens, and tourists, generating significant income for Demostinet businesses.

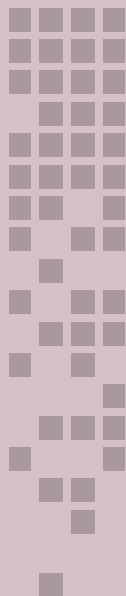
I live in Demostinet, and as its citizen, I found it very important to support the community. Other citizens and I have come together to support our artists financially through a **donation-based system** to cover their exhibition fees. I also saw that many artists and community members have set up **crowdfunding**, inviting everyone to invest in their performances, which will benefit Demostinet's economy. By engaging businesses and residents this way, we are creating a sense of responsibility and community.

A large part of the country relies on tourism. Still, this imposition has inevitably reduced artistic performances, affecting not only our artists but also small businesses, including mine. I took the liberty of organizing a form of secret resistance with others who feel the same way, using the night to create graffiti here and there, utilizing these empty spaces as we see fit. We depict the loss and consequences that this new policy is causing for Demostinet's inhabitants.

4

Demostinet Council introduces a new online voting system for policies that affect everyday decisions in residents' lives. However, the system comes with specific requirements: voters must possess a high-quality smartphone or computer, have reliable internet access, and complete a complex verification process. While the council claims that the new system is designed to increase efficiency and security, some groups feel excluded and struggle to adapt to the new requirements.

I am so proud of our community organizations! They are carrying out an open dialogue with Demostinet Council to ensure equal opportunities for everyone. Thanks to their efforts, the council, along with some supportive community members, has launched a series of digital literacy workshops to help anyone who needs assistance navigating the new voting system. And for those without internet access or devices, they have also made a paper system available. It's great to see our voices being heard!

Demostinet Scenario 4 Solution



I didn't know exactly what to do. But then I thought that probably other people felt the same. So why don't go ask them directly? My neighbours and I started a **door-to-door campaign** to **collect the signatures** to abolish this new voting system. I see this initiative engages people and **citizens are discussing** and explaining the challenges posed by the requirements. We have documented all the issues and presented its summary to the Council in form of a report.

Demostinet Scenario 4 Solution



I think it's unfair for someone to set requirements so high that only a few can meet them. It's like if I had some skills and decided that my standards should be the norm for everyone else. But I won't stand for that. I'm going to set a new standard! My friends and I know our way around **tech**—just look at how we **engage online**! We are launching a cyber prank. We have published an AI video with the faces of the Council Members dancing and barking. Be ready, barking dog never bites, but our online pen does!

5

A powerful new journal, funded by a group of wealthy businesspeople, has quickly become a well-known source in Demostinet. The journal promotes narratives that align with the interests of the funding class, while dissenting voices are taken down. Over time, readers notice that the criticism and investigative reports disproportionately target certain demographics. Despite concerns being raised by some citizens, the journal continues to shape public discourse, amplifying divisive ideologies.

Demostinet Scenario 5 Solution



I love how this **community-led** initiative brings together **independent journalists** and individuals to raise awareness about the journal's narrative. Through our **public meetings** and discussions, we familiarise citizens with the concepts of **media literacy** and inform them about alternative sources of information. From this engagement, something beautiful has emerged! A new independent media platform has been created that offers a fresh and inclusive perspective.

Demostinet Scenario 5 Solution



We have heavily criticized the journal. We don't like the tone, we don't appreciate how fellow citizens are treated, and we're opposed to the sense of division they've tried to create. After this long battle, the journal finally implemented a monthly **feedback initiative**. Their offices now have a **box** where citizens can write down their concerns and perspectives, or they can send an email to WeListenToYou@demostient.com.

Demostinet Scenario 5 Solution



Honestly, in response to the journal's influence and the narratives it promotes, some residents are really offended. We have decided to use the feedback initiative to express our frustrations. We are sending direct messages to the journal's members, and as far as I know, some journalists are even **receiving anonymous notes** that include their home addresses. It's a way, for the journalists, to reflect on the discomfort many marginalized citizens are feeling and the fear they experience every day.

— It is very understandable what you are saying, but I can **escort** you and be with you during this kind of procedure.

One day, new students from a nearby school arrived. There had always been **rivalry** between the two schools, which led to **bad** language and **tough** competition during games. When the new students came, no one talked to them. After a few days, **fights** started happening at school, and many kids **felt scared** to go to school because they didn't want to see more violence.

As the principal of the school, I will **increase** the **supervision** during school hours, particularly during breaks. Also, the students that will be involved in this kind of situation will face **stricter** disciplinary measures, such as **exclusion** of the game activities of the school year and from all the excursions of the school. And I am sure that this will **pull themselves together**, and everything will be okay!

As the principal of the school, I believe we can organize an **introductory** activity tomorrow morning to help everyone **get to know each other** and start building trust.

As the principal of the school, I think that we need to introduce a **holistic** integration approach that includes **ongoing** support and education for both new and existing students. Every 15th day within the classes will have **conflict resolution workshops**, peer mentoring, and open forums, and once per month we can have a **discussion** all the classes together in order to address the needs of each class or new educational needs.

Gin was born in another galaxy. But he grew up and came at a very young age to the land of The Sciencelands. He had **never visited** his country of origin, nor did he speak his native language. In his school, he had friends who didn't care where he was from, but there were also classmates who **didn't like him**. They made **fun of him** and sometimes treated him in a **discriminatory** way. The biggest difficulties he faced were when the teacher put him in groups with classmates who had discriminatory attitudes, and as a result, he was **afraid** or even refused to give his homework.

Teacher: I think that the best of Gin is to choose **not to have a direct** intervention and to keep an eye on him regarding the situation. If Gin wants, he knows where he **can find me**.

Teacher: I think that I need to **first** speak with Gin in order to understand exactly what is happening. **After**, I will address this to the principal, and **then** I will suggest implementing a series of exercises that focus on **diversity, inclusion, and respecting** each other.
